In the midst of these crises we have witnessed tremendous acts of bravery from members of the public, our emergency services and others who have rallied round to assist in the best way they can. SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

Finally, summer has arrived and with high temperatures forecast over the next few days, we should make the most of the good weather. The impromptu Village Tidy Group meeting early one evening in the second week of June has never seen the village looking more pristine. A big thank you to the small number of dedicated individuals who gave up their spare time to help mow and strim all the grass in the village, including the church yard. The Tidy Group continues to do an outstanding job and generally meets on the last Saturday of the month at 8.30 am behind the Coronation Hall and, after about a 3-hour session mowing, strimming and litter picking, retires to the Hume for lunch and refreshments. A convivial group, the next Tidy Group clean-ups are Saturday 29 July and 26 August. Please come along and help and get to know your village and other residents.

The last Parish Council meeting coincided with an AGM at which Cllr Coy was elected as vice chair. Two parish councillor vacancies remain unfilled, although one of these should be filled by co-option at the next meeting in July. We still await a decision from DBEIS on the Heckington Fen Wind Farm and with only 8 months left to the original planning application deadline, no news is still good news. The Children's Play Area initiative is now moving forward with a great deal of support indicated by most parents. Having now chaired an outline options meeting at the beginning of June and stood up the Working Group, 2 options (indoor or outdoor versions at the Village hall) will be presented to the Village Hall Committee at a meeting in the coming weeks for a final decision as to viability. If accepted and endorsed, the Chair of the working group (Mrs Michelle Taylor) will then take this initiative forward, with the help of NKDC specialists and parents, and will report regularly to the parish council.

Fortuitously, a few weeks ago some of us managed to bump into the best kept village judges whilst they were doing their preliminary rounds. All indications suggest they were very impressed with the state of the village and it is therefore reasonable to expect that we might make the final cut – fingers crossed. More still needs to be done however, so please let us make a collective effort to try and win this prestigious accolade and keep our gardens neat and tidy. You will have all noticed that SID (Speed Indicator Device) is back up and now working properly which should help slow most of the traffic coming through the village. The Dog Warden continues with her rounds and we have asked for a consultation meeting with the NKDC environmental manager to try and effect further measures to reduce dog fouling and to penalise the extremely anti-social miscreants who still fail to pick up after their dogs. Similarly, and after the poor workmanship shown by the sub-contractors who re-surfaced part of Town Bridge, we are seeking a meeting with the Highways Manager to discuss all the old outstanding issues.

To broaden the appeal of the parish council and to also make us more accessible to parishioners, but mainly the younger generations, we are looking to set up a council Facebook site. Once this has been put into effect I will let you know all the details.
